Dear Parent/Guardian,

Welcome to the December newsletter. As we exit Level 5 restrictions and begin the month of December, it is important to pause and reflect on the three months that have passed since Scoil Eoghain reopened its door on the 1st September. Like many school communities up and down the country there have been significant difficulties and challenges in the areas of logistics, staffing and many other organisational matters. Like other schools we too have had to deal with positive cases presenting within the school and obviously the impact of this extended to those deemed close contacts and asked to restrict their movements etc. Despite this we take comfort in the fact that zero transmission within the school setting has occurred. This is as a direct result of people doing all the right things when showing symptoms or being named as a close contact. It is also a direct result of staff being extremely vigilant and perhaps most of all the children who are being absolutely brilliant in their compliance with all that has been asked of them through this very prolonged difficult time.

Zero transmission is a record that we would very much like to keep and in order to do this we shall need everyone's help. Below are a few key points that we would want people to continue to follow;

- 1. If a child is in any way symptomatic, keep them at home.
- 2. Frequently remind your child of the importance of good hand hygiene and sanitising.
- 3. Limit unnecessary contacts.
- 4. Do not arrive to school prior to 9.00 am, be prompt and punctual at pick up time whilst respecting others space.
